Top brewer: Ossett Brewery in West Yorkshire has taken a top spot in the Society of Independent Brewers' SIBA North East Independent Beer Awards. The brewery won the overall gold in the bottle and can competition with 'Alpaca', an aromatic double dry-hopped IPA brewed under their new SALT Beer Factory brand. The awards are judged by fellow brewers and other representatives from the industry, making these the much coveted 'brewers' choice' awards in the North East, including beers from brewers spanning Berwick-upon-Tweed to Sheffield.
